throughout the world today former nation states as disparate as yugoslavia somalia and canada have either disintegrated or threaten to splinter into regions the conflicts are economic social ethnic linguistic religious political and cultural higgins and savoie analyze the reasons for these conflicts and show why attempts to eliminate regional disparities within nations have been largely unsuccessful this volume is a highly readable comprehensive survey of the literature and current debates in the fields of regional economics development policy and planning

this book focuses on the role of the state in economic development in a variety of third world settings through an in depth analysis of the past several decades berberoglu examines three major alternative development theories developmentalism dependency and neo marxist he then critically analyzes these theories and their variants to set the stage for a detailed examination of various development paths two paths of capitalist development are contrasted the export oriented neo colonial model and the import substituting state capitalist model the role of the state in each of these alternatives is discussed in the context of the balance of class forces berberoglu also provides case studies of turkey tanzania peru and india countries in which the state played a significant role in the development process in each case he demonstrates that the process of state capitalist development inevitably leads to neo colonialism this export oriented path ties third world countries to centers of world capitalism with all the consequent contradictions that such a linkage entails the book outlines the class nature of these contradictions on a global scale and maps out the balance of class forces and struggles the role of the state and the resultant revolutionary developments that are part of the process of social change and transformation now under way in many third world countries also included is an appendix highlighting the need for a class centered approach in development studies

this introductory text explains and places in an historical context the development theories behind contemporary debates such as globalization the author describes and explains how approaches to development have changed over time and how approaches vary spatially

the authors have grouped the theories into three classical families which differ in their views relative to the prime motives underlying human nature they show how theories are specific examples of more general points of view called paradigms the theories chosen to represent the three paradigms the endogenous paradigm exogenous paradigm and the constructivist paradigm were selected because they met four criteria importance as judged by academic and research psychologists fertility as judged by the amount of research the theory has generated scope as judged by the variety of phenomena the various theories explain family resemblance as judged by how well each theory represents its paradigm the authors present the paradigm case in the lead chapter for each paradigm this paradigm case is the best example for the paradigm the authors explain why paradigm cases are important and give them more detailed treatment than other theories in the same paradigm

polyvagal theory provides a breakdown of how the nervous system responds and reacts to unconscious messages of safety and threat this accessible guide explores polyvagal theory and its potential for fully understanding and supporting the behaviours of children and young people in emotional distress at school by exploring how early childhood experiences such as abuse trauma an insecure attachment or bereavement can have a detrimental impact on the development of the child's nervous system we can view their behaviours in a new light polyvagal theory in the classroom contains a wealth of activities to use in the classroom delves into new understandings of what is happening to children and young people when they become dysregulated introduces practical ways to support pupils emotional wellbeing promote better mental health and help to develop their capacity to self regulate contains exercises which provide opportunities for the reader to reflect on their own practice packed full of case studies to bring theory to life this book builds skills to gain awareness and control of our own nervous systems and to become the safe and calm presence for the overwhelmed child this empowering book is essential reading for mainstream primary and secondary teachers SENCOs and teaching support staff

achieve in this book the authors seek effective ways to merge theory with workplace practice and advocate the modular preceptor method whereby participants work together in dyads and triads with a preceptor acting as advisor and instructor unlike traditional management development programs which do not usually lead to behavior changes the modular preceptor model has behavior change as the basic aim participants can remain at work while experiencing individualized learning developing problem solving skills and acquiring new knowledge which can be immediately applied to work situations various ways of learning such as passive lecture case study discussion and experiential role playing games sensitivity training are examined no single mode of learning can be comprehensive and adequate for all situations the authors contend however that experiential learning is most effective for increasing the will and competence to learn and for using what is learned to change manager behavior the purpose of the modular preceptor approach is not to present answers to specific managerial or organizational problems but to help the participant acquire new problem definition and problem solving skills and the confidence to apply them on the job this book also analyzes the contribution of the behavioral sciences to the philosophies and techniques behind management instruction and examines the role of the university in management development and the future direction of mba programs for anyone concerned with meaningful and effective management development this book is an invaluable resource
